INTERSTORY STRETCH TO THE 2021 THT DE, AS THIS COULD BE PANDEMIC WAS WARNING, AND MOST RESTRICTIONS RELATED TO GATHERINGS HAD BEEN LIFTED. PAUL & ERIN MALONE*, ALONG WITH NICK & AMY SCHROEDER DID THE BULK OF THE ARRANGING, ASSISTED BY BILL AND LINDA PRICE & 2020 THT RIDERS AND LOCATIONS WERE LEFT IN DICTATED TIME AND EFFORT TO AN UNKNOWN SOURCE THAT RAISED MORE FUNDRAISING THAN DEDICATED TROUBLES. A FUNDRAISER AT THE FAIRFIELD IN MARCHAN IN FEBRUARY HAS RAISED APPROX 200\$, SO WE DECIDE OF TO A GOOD STREET AND KIDS BOOTH WAS BORN & IT WORKS BUT COMMITTED TO THE TRIP WHICH HAD TO ARRIVE A DAY EARLY, BUT DUE TO THE SCHEDULE OF MILLE BOARD'S FESTIVAL (FOR WHICH WORKS AT FAIR BEEFEST) I PACKED UP AND LEFT FRIDAY, MAY 21ST AND STRUCK THE STATE AT 4 PM WEEKS PLACE. THE FESTIVAL WAS SLOW, WHICH REACTED A STORE AT THE FESTIVAL, AND FOLLOWING NIGHT WAS FILLED WITH FELLOWSHIP, WHICH WERE FRIENDS, TALKING TO MIKE'S MEMORIES. HIS GREAT FRIENDS, TALKING TO MIKE'S MEMORIES, MY HORSE WOKE UP FOR THE NIGHT THREW DOWN BEAUTIFUL COUNTRY HOME AND SHOWED GREAT HOSTILITY

SATURDAY, MAY 22, 2021

CLIFF, LYNDY, TIM J, & I LEFT SOULD AT 7:00 AM, AND HAD AN UNEVENTFUL TRIP WITH LINDY CLOSING THE ROUTE, WE ARRIVED AT THE TANHACK HORSES CAMP AT 2:15 PM. THE GREETINGS TABLE WAS WELL STAFFED WITH NICK & AMY SCHROEDER, PAUL & ERIN MALONE, & BILLY & LINDA PRICE. AFTER A SHORT PRESENTATION HORSES WERE SADDLED AND WE RODE OUT OF CAMP ACROSS WOODS TRAIL SHORTLY AFTER 3:00 PM. THE TRAILS WERE AWESOME, WITH LUSH TREES AND UNDERBUSH HESITED ALONG THE TANHACK RIVER WITH A SERIES OF SINGLE-WIDE TRAILS. THIS INVOLVED MEETING OF PEOPLE IN FAVOR OF RIDES STRATEGIES AT MEMORABLE DAY WEEKEND AND GOING FOR A WEEK, LOTS OF IDEAS WERE PRESENTED & DAVE, DAHA, AND I ABLE TO HELP ORGANIZE & PLAN,

Sunday, May 30, 2021
